Proclamation

- WHEREAS: Esophageal cancer is among the fastest growing cancer diagnoses in the United States; and
- WHEREAS: Esophageal cancer is a disease in which cancer cells form in the tissues of the esophagus, often preceded by symptoms of pain or difficulty swallowing, indigestion, heartburn, hoarseness, and coughing. Risk factors for esophageal cancer include gastric reflux, heavy alcohol and tobacco use; and
- WHEREAS: Esophageal cancer is among the deadliest of cancers, with fewer than one in five patients surviving five years. Survival rates are low because the cancer is usually discovered at the advanced stage, when treatment outcomes are poor; and
- WHEREAS: If esophageal cancer is discovered early, chances for recovery and survival are far better, and treatments for the disease is possible, including: surgery, chemotherapy, radiation, laser therapy, and electrocoagulation; and
- WHEREAS: During this month, we raise awareness of esophageal cancer in Minnesota, in order to promote early detection and treatment.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, MARK DAYTON, Governor of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim April 2015, as:

ESOPHAGEAL CANCER AWARENESS MONTH
