

Census Data Center Answers Your Data Needs

- The average travel time to work in 1979, in Minnesota was 17.9 minutes (1980 Census of Population).
- The number of gasoline service stations in Minnesota declined by 28% between 1972 and 1977 (1977 Census of Retail Trade).
- The number of gasoline service stations in Minnesota declined an additional 30% between 1977 and 1980 (County Business Patterns, 1980).
- On April 1, 1980, there were more persons in homes for the aged than in college dormitories, in Minnesota (1980 Census of Population).

Today the above information and much more is easily accessible through the fifty-eight members of the Minnesota Census Data Center network. These Minnesota members join over 1,000 other organizations across the county participating in the State Data Center program initiated by the Bureau of the Census in 1978.

As a result, the statistics that help Minnesota's businesses, governments and planning organizations are available closer to home - at state agencies, regional development commissions, campuses and libraries across the state. Each of the Data Center members is geared to serve the informational needs of state residents, either on the spot or through referral to the appropriate agency. Anyone who needs to know more about the social and economic make-up of his or her state, county, city or neighborhood can make good use of the centers.

Data Center Organization Is Now Complete

The three core agencies (State Demography Unit, MAPS at the University of Minnesota, and the Department of Education Information Center) in

September designated twenty-five affiliates, ten associates and twenty federal or census depository libraries as members of the network.

The purpose of the affiliate program is to provide multiple locations around the state where Census Bureau reports are on hand, general assistance in the use of these reports is available, and resource persons can provide information about other census data-related services available in Minnesota.

Affiliates of the Data Center include regional development commissions and planning organizations as well as public libraries throughout the state. These affiliates receive free copies of each census publication including the population and housing census for 1980 and 1970; economic censuses of retail and wholesale trade, manufacturing, construction, agriculture, services, and transportation; and county business pattern surveys.

Since the Census Bureau agreed to provide only twenty-five free publication collections to Minnesota affiliates, an additional ten organizations expressing interest in participation in the network have been designated as associate members. The associates may not have complete publication collections but are full Data Center members and can make referrals when necessary.

Twenty of the federal and census depository libraries dispersed throughout the state have also joined the Data Center network. These libraries receive Census Bureau publications and materials, as well as other statistical offerings of the federal government.

Data Center Members Provide Special Services

Minnesota Analysis and Planning System (MAPS), a part of the Agricultural Extension service of the University of Minnesota, is the depository for computer tape files in the Census Data



Center program. Since only about 10% of the data collected during the 1980 census will be available on printed reports and microfiche, MAPS is the resource for the other 90% found on summary tapes. Staff are well equipped to provide information about geographic or subject coverage of summary tape files, as well as answer questions about whether data items are found on tape, printed reports or microfiche.

On a fee for service basis, MAPS can provide detailed information to the minor civil division (MCD), census tract, enumeration district or block level. Their capabilities include the production of special reports on user-identified areas such as combinations of tracts and blocks to build a specific market area. MAPS can also supply comparisons of previous decennial censuses with the 1980 census, and census data for other states.

The Land Management Information Center (LMIC) in the Department of Energy, Planning and Development is a service bureau for mapping and graphics. The Center has its own computer system including specialized graphic devices that can be used to map or graph census data. Its inventory includes computer mapping files for all census geography in Minnesota including

counties, minor civil divisions, census tracts, 1980 voting precincts, enumeration districts and blocks. In addition, data about census units collected by other organizations can also be easily mapped or graphically related to census data. LMIC will assist users to do their own work on the LMIC system or will perform all of the necessary work on a contract basis.

LMIC capabilities include the production of a variety of maps and graphics in black and white or color. Either paper copies or slides are available. All work is performed on a cost-reimbursable basis.

Through joint efforts of MAPS and LMIC, Minnesota users can obtain special tabulations and visual presentations which are state-of-the-art in power and sophistication.
