

Agricultural Education For All Scholarship

Deadline	Applications will be accepted three times per year - February 1, July 1, and November 1. *Note – applications may be submitted <u>prior to</u> formal acceptance into an Agricultural Education-Teacher Preparation program.
Purpose	MAELC is committed to fostering a welcoming, inclusive, and supportive atmosphere that encourages individuals from all backgrounds to pursue teaching in agricultural education. The purpose of the MAELC Agricultural Education for All Scholarship is to provide financial support for both undergraduate and graduate students. All are welcome to apply, including those underrepresented within the agriculture teacher field.
	A shortage of high school agriculture teachers exists in Minnesota and nationally. As a result, there is a tremendous need for more students to become licensed to teach agricultural education. In addition, having agriculture teachers with various backgrounds and experiences improves students' engagement in the classroom and feelings of belonging. MAELC believes in assisting prospective agricultural education teachers that represents Minnesota' student population who will foster supportive and welcoming environments for all students.
Eligibility	<u>Undergraduate Students</u> - Applicant must be entering their first year or be currently enrolled in an Agricultural Education-Teacher Licensure program at Southwest Minnesota State University, the University of Minnesota-Crookston, or the University of Minnesota-Twin Cities. This includes incoming freshmen, transfer students (transferring colleges/universities or majors), and current students.
	<u>Graduate Students</u> - Applicant must be entering their first year or be currently enrolled in the University of Minnesota-Twin Cities Master of Science Initial or Additional Licensure program in Agricultural Education (<u>https://ag-ed.cfans.umn.edu/graduate/master-science/prof-studies</u>).
	Students from a traditionally underrepresented group in the agriculture teaching field are encouraged to apply. Applicant must be a U.S. citizen or permanent resident who is firmly committed to teaching in Minnesota.
	Students are eligible to receive this scholarship more than once. Priority will be given to those who have not previously received this funding.
Selection	The MAELC scholarship committee will review applications and select individuals for interviews. After interviews are completed, the committee will choose scholarship recipients. Selection criteria include academic merit, passion, and commitment to become an agricultural education teacher, as well as financial need. Scholarship funds will be transferred directly into student accounts of successful applicants and may affect students' financial aid package.
Funding	Scholarships awarded up to \$5,000/recipient.
Materials	The application will require answering essay questions and providing an unofficial transcript and resume.

Tips When - Applications are reviewed for both content AND quality

Applying

- Focus responses on your current intentions related to becoming an agriculture teacher. Be sure to add information about your plans to use your agricultural education degree after graduation
 - Remember that those reviewing the application do not know you think about what you want the committee to know as to why you are deserving of this scholarship

Application Apply online at <u>http://mn.gov/maelc/scholarships.html</u>. Please be prepared to answer the following questions (up to 300-word limit per question):

- 1. What inspired you to choose the agricultural education teaching profession as your career path?
- 2. How are you paying for your education? (work, loans, scholarships/fellowships, family, etc.) Are there any special circumstances or issues you would like the committee to know?
- 3. What are your career plans after graduating with an Agricultural Education degree? Specify how your collegiate studies relate to that plan.
- 4. Identify your beliefs, background, and life experiences that will contribute to Agricultural Education and its students. This can include, but is not limited to:
 - Your experience helping others gain access to resources necessary for success
 - Your experiences that influence your perspective on developing classroom environments where all are welcome and able to achieve their personal and educational goals
 - Your history and/or understanding of overcoming obstacles to achievement
