Your letter to Mrs. _____ was referred to me. I am sorry that you are so ill and are having such a hard time.

In regard to _____'s clothing, we have recently had a donation of some clothes that will fit her and it will be all right for you to omit sending clothing at this time. _____ is very destructive of her clothing and often tears it in bits. The matron says that on this account she has no outgrown garments that would be of any use to the younger child. She is more apt to destroy her clothing than to wear it out. She has had very good health and is looking very well at present. She is still very active and we are unable to give her very large doses of thyroid on this account but she seems to be growing and her health is good.
