The parties have also submitted letters to the Court proposing an exchange of settlement documents and a time line for an exchange of those settlement documents.

Based upon the record before the Court, the presentations of the parties, and the Court being otherwise duly advised in the premises, the Court hereby enters the following:

ORDER

Exchange of Proposed Settlement Documents

1. The Defendants shall submit a detailed draft settlement agreement to the Plaintiffs by April 2, 2010.
2. The Plaintiffs shall submit a detailed response to the Defendants' settlement documents no later than April 14, 2010.

Settlement-Status Conference

3. The parties are respectfully directed to contact Magistrate Judge Franklin L. Noel's Calendar Clerk, Cathy Orlando, at 612-664-5110, for the purpose of setting up a settlement conference to discuss potential resolution of the case before the Court as well as the necessity, if any, of temporary injunctive relief, absent stipulation of the parties.

The settlement discussions shall include the development of a consent decree-settlement agreement to resolve some or all of the issues before the Court.
