SUBJECT: 1978-79 Status Report - Developmental Achievement Center Grant-In-Aid

Minnesota Statutes, Sections 252.21-.26, establishes the authority of the Commissioner of Public Welfare to make grants, within the limits of money appropriated by the State Legislature, to licensed Developmental Achievement Centers (DACs) for mentally retarded and/or cerebral palsied persons, supervise the operation thereof, and establish such rules as are necessary to carry out the purpose of these statutes. This report details the efforts of the Community Programs Division of the Department to carry out these responsibilities.

DACs are operated by nonprofit corporations or local government agencies. The overall goal of a DAC is to help individuals to function in society as independently as possible. To accomplish this, an Individual Program Plan is developed for each person, depending on the particular needs of that person. The plan may be directed toward development of sensory motor, communication, social-behavioral, prevocational, homeliving and leisure skills. Ancillary services may also be provided and may include such services as speech and hearing therapy; physical and occupational therapy; special education and leisure time guidance; counseling with parents and social work follow-up. This plan may be implemented in a state-licensed facility or in the person's home. also provide transportation to and from centers to enable all eliqible individuals to attend the program.

CENTERS

There are currently 104 DACs located throughout the state, and an additional 39 satellite programs of these centers. The programs range in size from 6-167 participants. Thirty-six (36) DACs have a population of more than 45 participants each. Two new DACs will be opening in October of this year. One is the Behavioral Achievement Center, Inc. located in Hennepin County. This DAC will serve, on an intensive, short-term basis, 15-20 mentally retarded and/or cerebral palsied adults with behavior problems severe enough to prevent them from participation in other DACs. The goals of the program are to reduce or eliminate these problems, thereby, permitting the individuals to enter existing DACs. The second new DAC is located in Roseau County. A group of concerned citizens and professionals in the field of mental retardation formed a corporation in late 1977 for the purpose of developing and operating a DAC. A planner/coordinator was hired through CETA funds to develop the program, find a facility, and identify participants. Nine adult applicants have been identified who have not been receiving developmental programming.

STAFF

DACs employ more full-time persons (977) than part-time (232). Over one-half of the full-time staff have academic backgrounds in special education or education. This is also true of 45 percent of the part-time employees. Over 50 percent of both full-time and part-time staff have four-year college degrees with an additional 100 persons holding a master's or doctoral degree.

ENROLLMENT

Attachment I shows a comparison of enrollment figures for fiscal years 1973-1979. Projected enrollment for fiscal year 1979 is a conservative estimate. Year-end enrollment figures usually reflect a higher population.

The number of participants served through homebound and adult programs is increasing yearly. Preschool population remains fairly stable in spite of recent legislation extending education services to four year old children who are mentally retarded. School contracts with DACs are steadily decreasing as more school districts develop special education services.

PARTICIPANTS

Nearly 72 percent of the total population served in DACs is over 21 years of age. Approximately one-half of all DAC participants are between 22 and 42 years of age. Slightly more males are served than females.

Participants generally range in level of disability from mildly retarded to profoundly retarded with the majority falling into the moderate range. Seventy-five (75) centers are also serving persons with cerebral palsy.

A substantial number of participants are further handicapped in other ways, such as blindness, deafness, inability to speak and being wheelchair bound.

Of all DAC participants, 30 percent are currently under legal guardianship or conservatorship to the Commissioner of Public Welfare. Ninety-seven (97) percent of these are adults.

Approximately one-third (1,500 persons) of all DAC participants have previously lived in a state hospital. Ninety-eight (98) percent of homebound and preschool participants live in their natural or adoptive homes. Fifty-eight (58) percent of the population receiving adult services reside in ICF facilities and 40 percent in natural or foster homes.

PROGRAM FUNDING

Attachment II is a summary of DAC funding for fiscal years 1973-1979 based on application projections for those years. Actual figures vary slightly. State participation in DAC funding has decreased each year since 1976. The statewide average DAC program grant for fiscal year 1979 equals about 42 percent of net adjusted program budgets, a decrease of two percent from the previous year. Although there have been increases in the appropriations, the increases in budgets have been even greater.

Grant-in-aid program funds are allocated on a formula basis that was developed with the assistance of the DAC Advisory Task Force. This formula bases the allocation for each center on the units of service to be provided, with loading factors for homebound, preschool, adult units of service, and for nonambulatory adult participants. (See Attachment III.)

The fiscal year 1979 average DAC program unit costs are: \$34.48 for homebound, \$28.62 for preschool, and \$15.69 for adult programs. These figures include a 90 percent utilization factor. Individual unit costs continue to vary greatly across the state. Some of the reasons for this variation are: size of program, amount of special services provided (speech therapy, physical therapy, etc.), staff ratios, staff salaries, occupancy costs, and degree of handicap of participants served.

The total state program funds available for this fiscal year are \$6,067,962. These funds are being used in the following manner:

TRANSPORTATION FUNDING

The Legislature provides a special appropriation to pay for 100 percent of approved costs for the transportation of DAC participants to and from centers. The impact of this legislation is to provide services for many individuals who otherwise would not be able to attend DACs.

Based on a 93 percent response from a questionnaire sent to all DACs, transportation is being provided in the following manner:

The appropriation for transportation for fiscal year 1979 allowed for a six percent increase in expenditures. Because transportation budgets exceed this appropriation, budgets were approved up to a six percent increase over the fiscal year 1978 transportation grant, or the fiscal year 1979 transportation request, whichever was less. Levels of transportation expenditures for the first six months of the year will be monitored, and adjustments will be made wherever possible. Historically DACs have underspent their projections and 100 percent funding has been achieved.

The total state transportation funds available for this fiscal year are \$2,576,600. These funds are being used in the following manner:

ADJUSTMENTS IN FUNDING

During the year, the following adjustments in DAC grant-in-aid may be made:

- Emergency program grants will be made in January and April, based on the following priorities:
 - 1. Additional costs due to licensing regulations.
 - 2. Situations that mean disruption of the existing program.
 - 3. Services to new participants.

- Emergency transportation grants will be made, based on the following priorities:
 - 1. Additional costs due to licensing regulation.
 - 2. Funding original requests at 100 percent if still needed.
 - 3. Other emergencies.
- Unit cost adjustments will be considered in rare instances.
- Equalization aid.
- End of year reallocations of all unused program funds.

RULE #31

A task force of seven DAC directors and Community Programs Division staff participated in the development of revised Rule #31. The task force was formed in August, 1977 and held ten full-day meetings with special assignments between meetings through February, 1978. The DAC Advisory Task Force reviewed the proposed rule and recommended that it be prepared for public hearing, with minor revisions. The draft has been reviewed by Department staff, DAC boards and directors, and MR coordinators of the area program boards. The final draft is in the process of official Department review and approval, and promulgation prior to July 1, 1979 is anticipated.

CONSULTATION AND TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE

Community Programs Division provides information regarding DACs and DAC grant-in-aid to DACs, county welfare boards and departments, human service boards, area MH-MR-CD boards and centers, and the general public. Staff works closely with the Minnesota Developmental Achievement Center Association and its regional organizations, DVR, State Departments of Education and Health, Developmental Disabilities, and the Association of Retarded Citizens.

This year, two administrative workshops were developed for DAC staff. Approximately 35 attended the workshop in Brainerd on September 20, and 60 attended the workshop in St. Peter on September 22.

Staff will make approximately 30 site visits to DACs in the state during the year. The purpose of these visits will be administrative consultation.

Staff also works closely with Hennepin and Ramsey Counties on their DACs annual grant-in-aid applications and budgets.

Application review meetings are held each spring with 84 out-state DACs, county welfare directors, and area board MR coordinators to review each DAC's plan of service, budgets, and funding for the fiscal year.

ISSUES

It is anticipated that DACs will be asked to expand their programs to serve additional participants in the future. These additional participants will be individuals discharged from state institutions, community residents not currently enrolled in DACs, and individuals completing their public school education. Special Education estimates there will be an additional 82 participants from education requesting DAC service each year through June 30, 1983.

The DAC statute allows for 60 percent funding of DAC programs and 100 percent funding of transportation. Attachment II shows a decrease each year since 1976 in the statewide average percent of program funding. If there is no increase in the appropriation for fiscal years 1980 and 1981, the combination of additional participants, inflation, and other increases in budgets will further decrease the state percentage of program funding. The effect of this will be to transfer a greater share of DAC costs to the local level.

Other DAC issues have been dealt with in the revision of Rule #31, and will be discussed and resolved at the public hearing on this Rule. Some of these issues are: the limitation of time individuals and programs may spend on work activity, minimum hours and days of service, funding and disbursement procedures, responsibilities of board of directors, and due process for admissions, suspensions and demissions.
